- Year 8: Channels Television

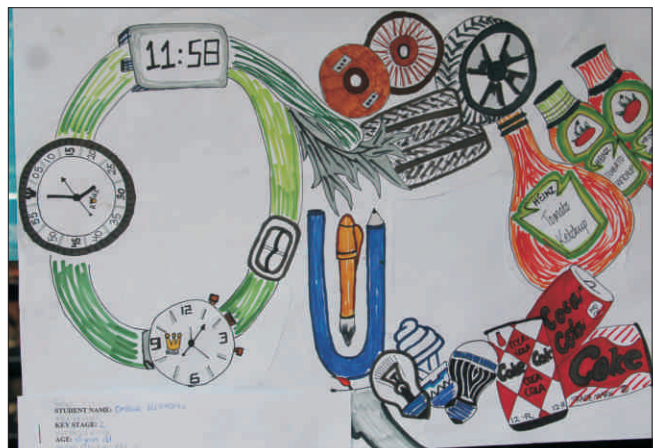
Without fail, the feedback we received from the students has been positive and more trips are being planned for Summer term.

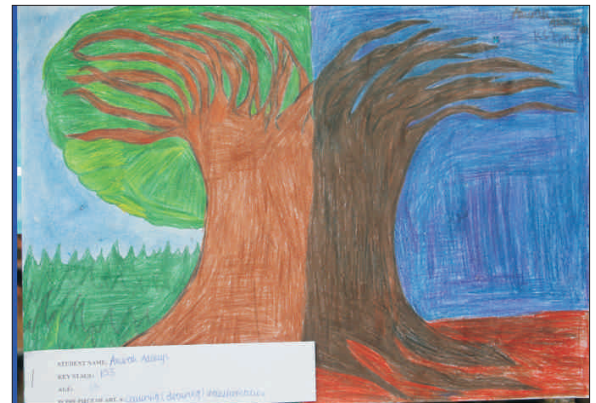
