# IMPORTANT NOTICE

## School Uniform Update

Following concerns raised by some parents regarding the quality and durability of certain school uniforms, we wish to inform you that the school uniform supplier, SKLD, has now phased out the 2023 skirt fabric (code IN0123). The fabric has been improved in terms of quality, weight, and durability. Colour fastness tests have also been carried out, and the new skirt fabric now comes with the code CN0125. The fabric weight has been increased from 280 GSM to 290 GSM to eliminate any transparency issues previously reported. In addition, the zips have been upgraded for smoother and easier use. We kindly ask parents to look out for this new code when purchasing. We are confident that these improvements will address previous concerns.
