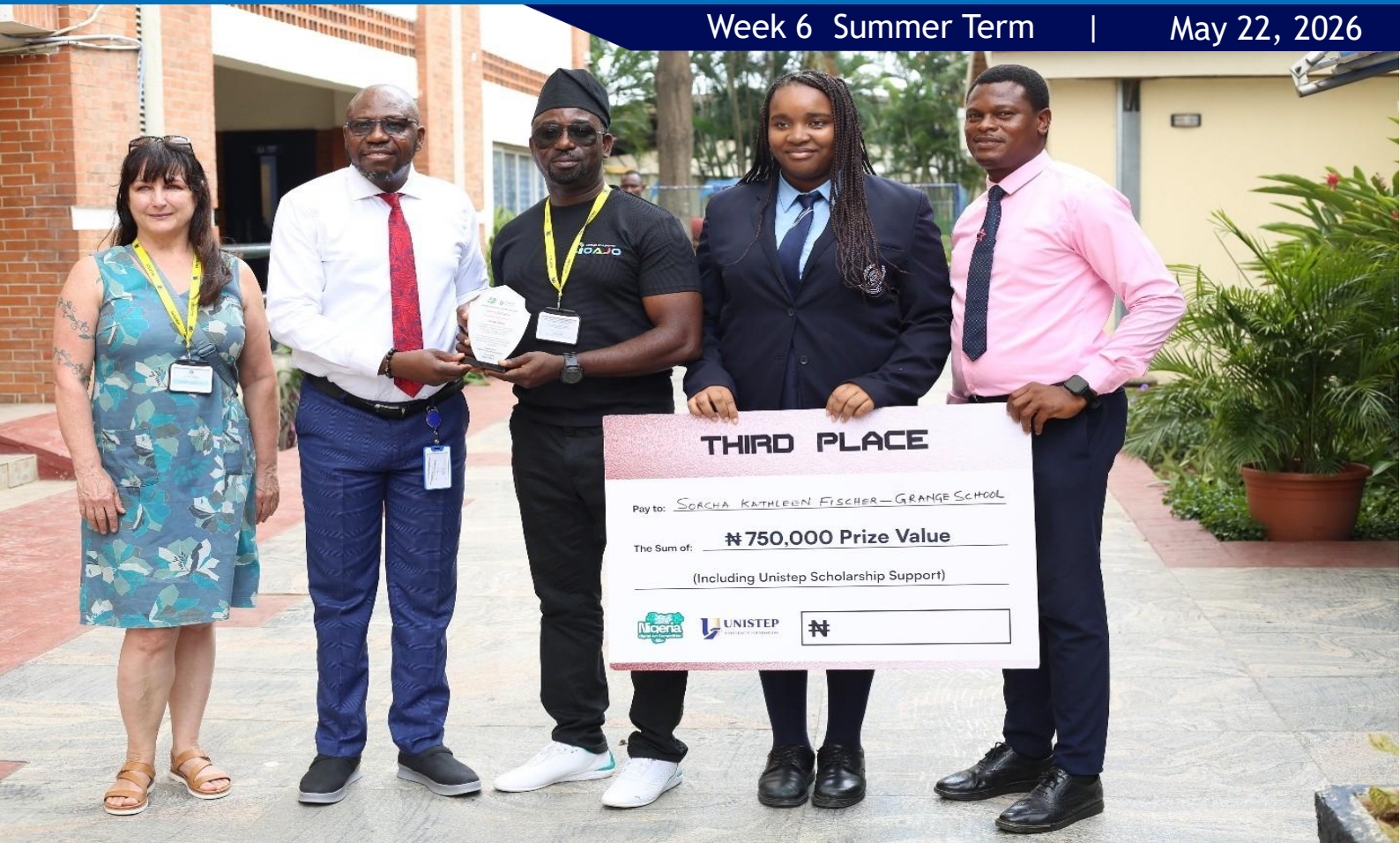

Temporary Suspension of Laptops in Secondary School

Please note that laptops and personal devices have been temporarily banned in the Secondary School from Friday, May 22, 2026, and for the first two weeks after half term due to repeated misuse of the BYOD policy by students. As a school, we are working towards achieving a suitable balance in the use of technology for learning. Even when laptops are reintroduced, we will continue exploring ways to ensure they are used appropriately and effectively to support learning, while also educating students on the responsible use of devices in school. During this two-week period, teachers will continue to use their usual teaching resources in class; however, materials will not be posted on Google Classroom. Parents are kindly asked to ensure that students do not bring laptops to school during this period. The only exception applies to Year 11 students coming in for examinations.

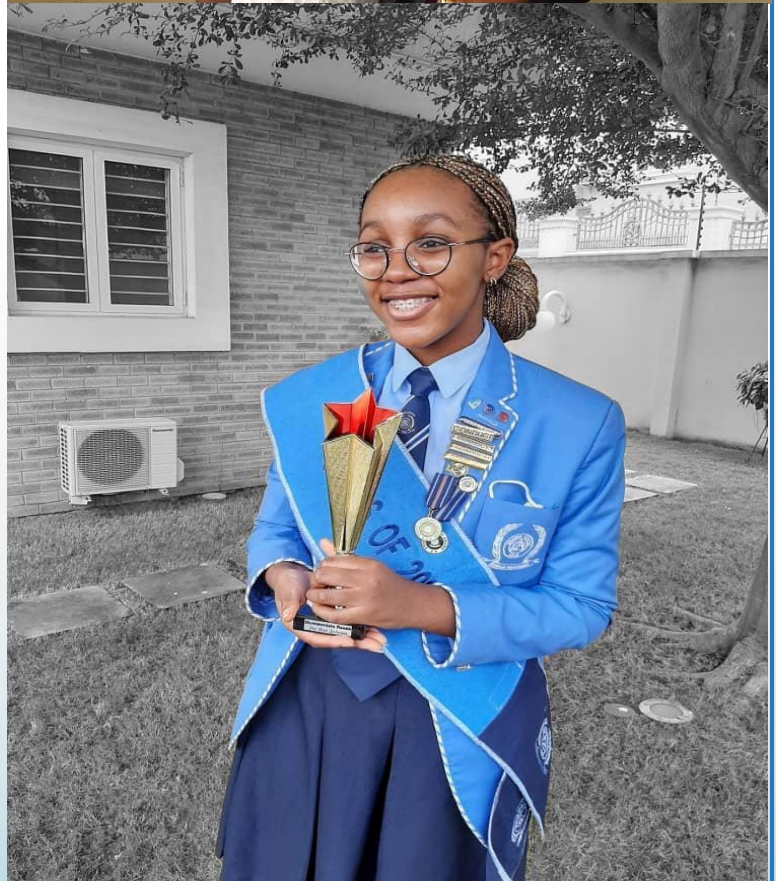

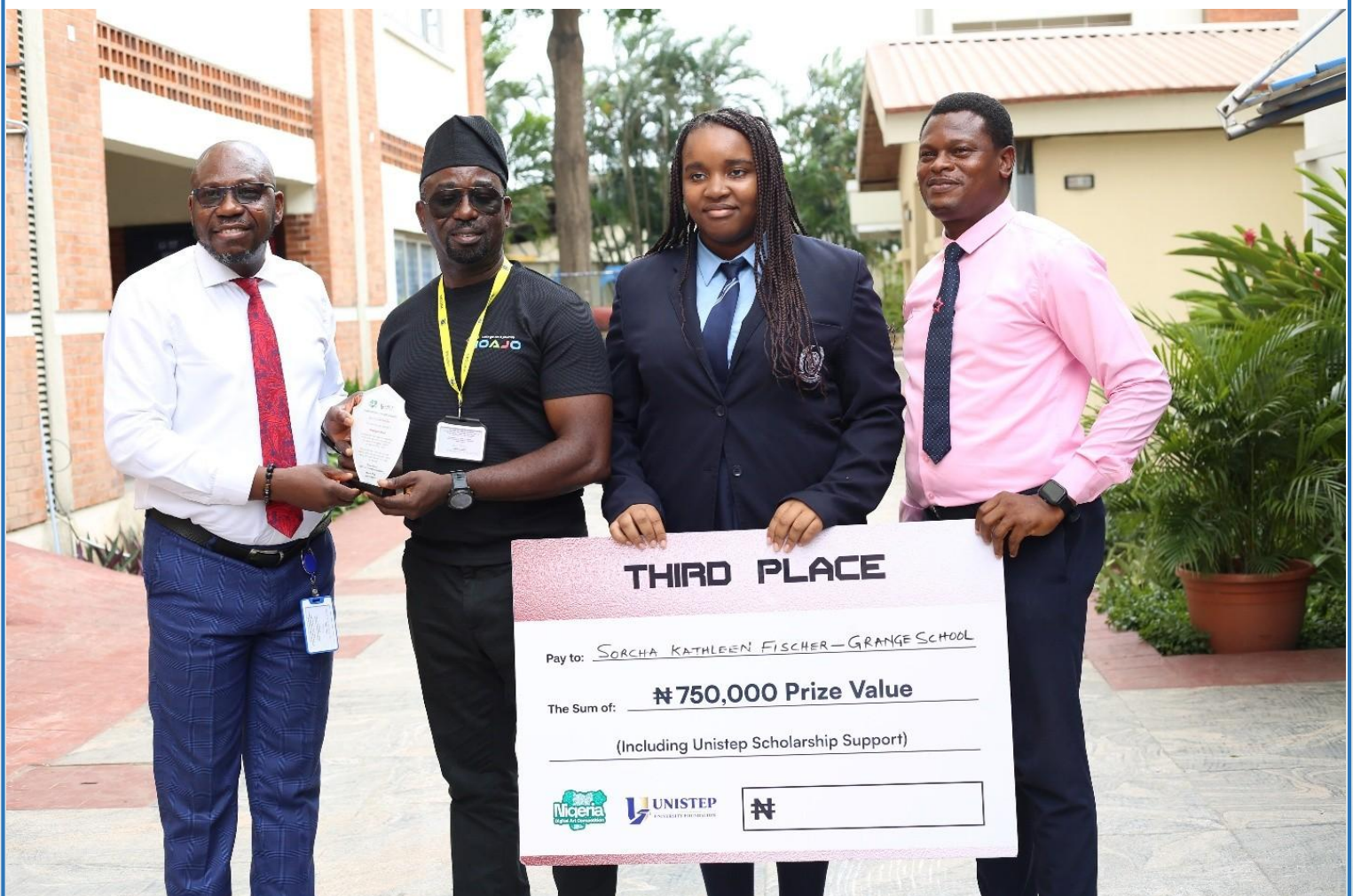

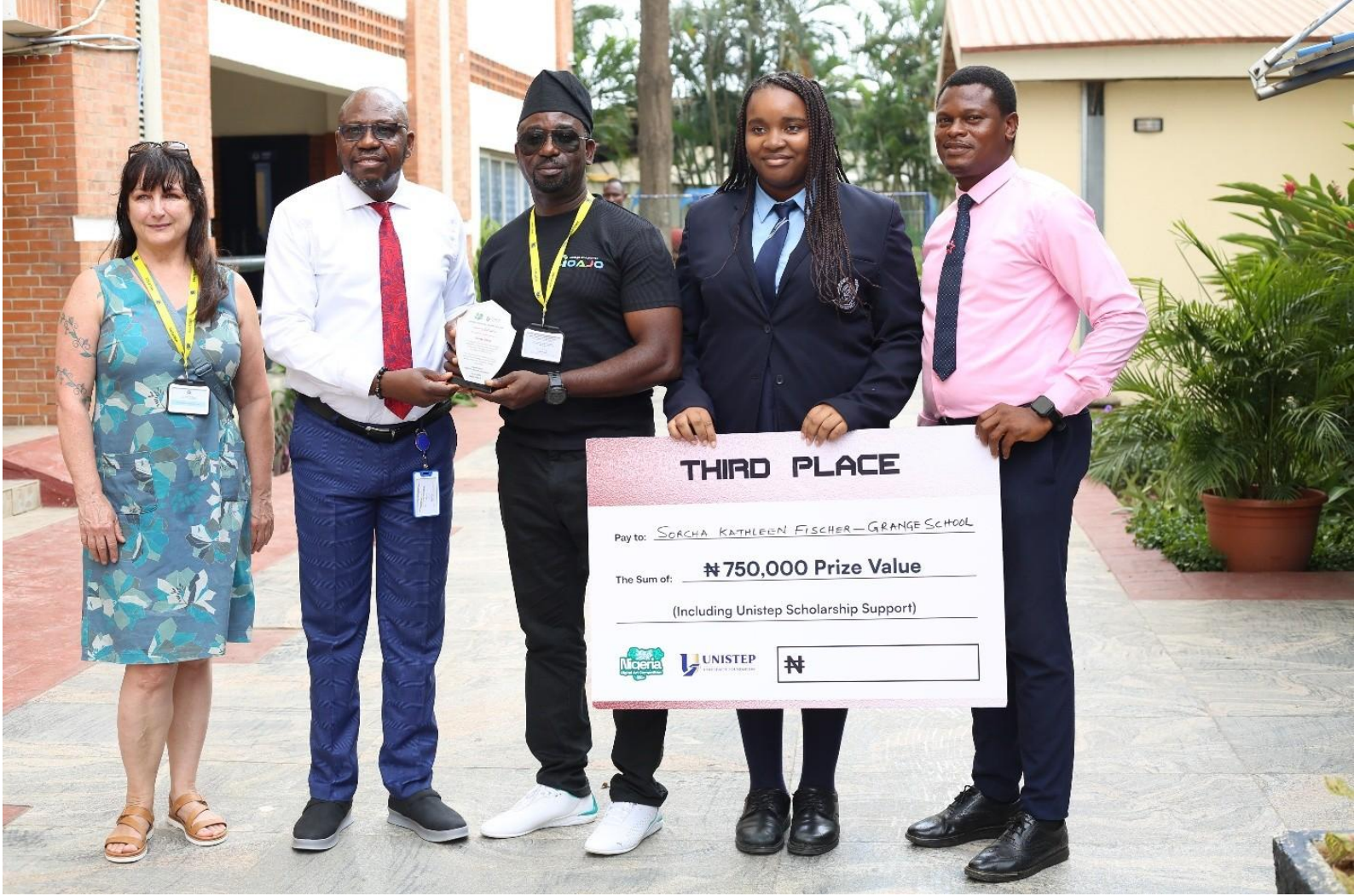
Celebrating
