France Trip

From 21 to 28 May, our Year 8 and Year 9 students enjoyed an exciting educational trip to Paris. The students combined language learning with visits to some of France's most famous landmarks. They attended French lessons, visited Notre-Dame Cathedral, the Latin Quarter, the Arc de Triomphe, the Eiffel Tower, and the magnificent Palace of Versailles. They also learned about French history at Les Invalides and visited Napoleon Bonaparte's tomb. The group spent time at the Louvre Museum, where they saw the famous Mona Lisa and explored the Egyptian Antiquities collection.

They also visited the Cité des Sciences, Europe's largest science museum, and enjoyed a scenic cruise along the River Seine. There was plenty of fun too. A day at Disneyland Paris was a favourite for many students, while football enthusiasts enjoyed a special behind-the-scenes tour of the PSG stadium, Parc des Princes. The trip ended with a farewell celebration and the presentation of participation certificates. It was a memorable week of learning, friendship, and new experiences, and we are delighted that our students had the opportunity to experience the rich culture and history of France firsthand.

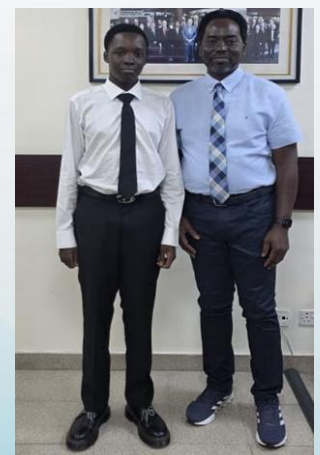
National Wildlife Campaign Grand Finale

Ahead of the event, students researched the manatee, an endangered aquatic mammal, and shared their findings with confidence. They explained its role in the ecosystem, why it is endangered, and how it can be protected. The students also prepared a creative display for their stand at the Wildlife Fair. Their work was recognised with the award for Most Creative Display, and they also won Overall Best Presentation.



Year 10 Work Experience:

While many students were enjoying their break, our Year 10 students were gaining valuable work experience in a range of organisations. They were introduced to careers in medicine, law, aviation, information technology, sales, and the creative industries. Despite the public holidays, most students attended their placements for three days, with many staying beyond the official closing time. DEL F EXAMINATIONS

The DELF (Diplôme d'études en langue française) examinations commenced successfully on Wednesday, 3 June, with the A1 level candidates.

The A2 level candidates sat their examinations on Thursday, 4 June. Out of the

42 candidates registered for this level, 38 participated in the examinations.

Student Laptop:

As previously communicated, the digital device ban is still in place and we will phase in the reintroduction of the BYOD Policy commencing with year 10 only initially (class by class). Further enhancements have been made to the school's network systems. The school has now upgraded its firewall and security infrastructure. The BYOD Policy clearly states only Microsoft Windows laptops will be permitted for use in school. Mac laptops or tablets are **NOT allowed** when we reintroduce the BYOD devices. In addition, students will be required to log on to the school wifi with their own unique codes allowing us to track their actions online. The school will communicate in due course which class in Year 10 will be permitted to bring laptops to school.
